Note from the Pastor

Merry Christmas. I would like to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas! Also thank you for your many thoughtful cards and gifts. They are greatly appreciated.

January 1st (the Solemnity of Mary). Because the Solemnity of Mary falls on Monday this year, it is *not*, a holy day of obligation. However, it is still a holy day that we can celebrate. Consequently, I will offer a Mass on Monday morning at 9:00am and the regular evening Mass at 5:30pm. There will be no New Year Eve's Mass on Sunday.

Saturday Night Mass Change from 5:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Update. The following explanation is also included in the parish newsletter mailed out Friday:

Because of concerns brought to the Parish Council in regards to the safety of some of our elderly parishioners, the Council voted to temporarily change the Saturday night Mass time to 5:00 p.m. during the winter months this year, starting Saturday, January 6, 2018. The 5:00 time gives more daylight for a person to get to Mass and back home before it's too dark and cold.

Feedback has already been given and is very much appreciated. The feedback will help us decide what is best for the overall good of the parish. The Council felt it needed to be sensitive to the concern brought to their attention and not delay in making a decision for a couple of months to study it further, at which time it would be too late to address the concern. At the February meeting the Council will revisit the issue.

Part of the feedback received is that for some of the 5:30 Mass crowd, it would be harder to make 5:00 p.m. because of their work. In fact for them a later Mass would be better. I did offer doing a 4:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Mass during the fall/winter time change and 6:00 p.m. during the spring/summer season. One Mass, probably the 4:30 Mass, would not have any scheduled ministries and be more like a daily Mass. A valid concern was that would affect the solemnity and the communal aspect of our Sunday worship. Although two Masses would solve the problem of both groups, the concern was whether it was the wise thing to do for the overall good of the parish. More thought and prayer would be needed before making that decision.

One option discussed would be that during the fall time change to have Mass at 5:00 p.m. and during the spring time change have Mass at 6:00 p.m. Again myself and the Council will consider all the inputs and with the guidance of the Holy Spirit decide what is best for the overall good of the parish.
